The HR round is often underestimated — yet it can make or break your candidacy. This question bank covers every major theme tested in HR rounds for law firm, in-house, judiciary, NGO, and government legal roles. For each category, we provide questions, what HR is actually assessing, and how to frame your best answer.

## A. Self-Introduction & Personality

**What HR is assessing:** Communication skills, self-awareness, confidence, and how you present your narrative.

### 1 Walk me through your resume.

*Answer Tip:* Don't just read it — tell a story. Connect each experience to the next, showing growth and clarity of purpose.

### 2 Describe yourself in three words.

*Answer Tip:* Pick words relevant to legal work: e.g., Analytical, Diligent, Adaptable. Be ready to explain each with an example.

### 3 What is your biggest achievement so far?

*Answer Tip:* Pick something that required effort and had measurable impact — a moot win, internship project, publication, or community initiative.

### 4 How would your peers describe you?

*Answer Tip:* Give an honest, positive answer backed by real examples. Avoid sounding arrogant or falsely modest.

### 5 What are your hobbies? How do they relate to law?

*Answer Tip:* Be genuine. Connect interests to skills: debate → advocacy, reading → research, writing → drafting.

## B. Motivation & Career Clarity

**What HR is assessing:** Whether you have a clear direction, genuine interest in the role, and long-term fit.

### 1 Why do you want to work in a law firm / in-house / NGO / government?

*Answer Tip:* Show that you understand the environment and have a specific reason tied to your career goals.

**2 Why this organisation specifically?**

*Answer Tip:* Name specific practice areas, recent cases, culture, or mentors. Generic answers are immediately detected.

**3 What kind of legal work excites you most?**

*Answer Tip:* Be specific. Show you've reflected on this and have a rationale.

**4 Where do you see yourself in 5/10 years?**

*Answer Tip:* Show ambition + realism. Align your vision with the firm's/organization's growth.

**5 Do you plan to pursue further studies (LLM, MBA, etc.)?**

*Answer Tip:* Be honest. If yes, show it aligns with your long-term career goal and that you're committed for this role.

## C. Teamwork & Interpersonal Skills

**What HR is assessing:** Collaboration style, communication, conflict resolution, and cultural fit.

**1 Describe a situation where you worked successfully in a team.**

*Answer Tip:* Use STAR method. Highlight your specific contribution and the collective outcome.

**2 Tell me about a conflict you had with a teammate. How did you resolve it?**

*Answer Tip:* Show maturity: you listened, communicated calmly, found common ground. Avoid blaming the other party.

**3 How do you build rapport with colleagues or seniors?**

*Answer Tip:* Respect, active listening, genuine interest, proactive help — share a real example.

**4 Would you rather work independently or as part of a team?**

*Answer Tip:* Show flexibility: 'I can do both effectively. I enjoy collaborating but can also work autonomously when needed.'

**5 How do you handle disagreements with a supervisor?**

*Answer Tip:* Respectfully raise the concern, listen to their reasoning, adapt if convinced. Show respect for hierarchy without blind compliance.

## D. Work Ethic & Stress Management

**What HR is assessing:** Reliability, time management, resilience under pressure, and professionalism.

**1 How do you manage multiple deadlines simultaneously?**

*Answer Tip:* Describe your actual system: priority lists, calendar blocking, early escalation of conflicts.

**2 Describe a time you worked under extreme pressure.**

*Answer Tip:* Use STAR. Show you stayed composed, took decisive action, and delivered.

**3 How do you deal with repetitive or mundane tasks?**

*Answer Tip:* Show professionalism: you understand the role of foundational work and approach it with diligence.

**4 Are you comfortable working long or irregular hours?**

*Answer Tip:* Be realistic. Reference past internships. Show commitment but also healthy self-awareness.

**5 How do you ensure you don't burn out?**

*Answer Tip:* Structure, breaks, exercise, strong support networks — show emotional intelligence.

## E. Values, Ethics & Professionalism

**What HR is assessing:** Integrity, professional conduct, ethical reasoning, and commitment to the profession.

**1 What does integrity mean to you as a legal professional?**

*Answer Tip:* Honesty with clients, courts, and colleagues. Acting consistently whether or not you're being observed.

**2 Have you ever faced an ethical dilemma? What did you do?**

*Answer Tip:* Share a real or hypothetical situation. Show clear ethical reasoning and principled decision-making.

**3 How do you maintain confidentiality?**

*Answer Tip:* Share only need-to-know information, secure documents properly, never discuss client matters in public.

**4 What would you do if asked to do something that violates professional ethics?**

*Answer Tip:* Firmly decline, explain why, and escalate to the appropriate authority.

**5 Why is professionalism important in the legal field?**

*Answer Tip:* Trust, reputation, access to justice, and the rule of law all depend on lawyers upholding high professional standards.

## F. Compensation & Logistics

**What HR is assessing:** Pragmatic fit, expectations management, and transition readiness.

**1 What is your expected stipend/CTC?**

*Answer Tip:* Research the market. Provide a range. Show you're open to negotiation based on the full package.

**2 How soon can you start?**

*Answer Tip:* Be specific. Account for any notice period, exam schedule, or prior commitment.

**3 Are you willing to relocate?**

*Answer Tip:* Be honest. If flexible, say so and explain why.

**4 Why are you leaving your current role / why didn't you join previously?**

*Answer Tip:* Keep it positive. Mention growth, fit, or learning — never speak negatively about past employers.

**5 Do you have any questions for us?**

*Answer Tip:* Always ask! E.g., onboarding, team culture, growth path, current key matters. Shows genuine interest.
